Welcome in Jesus' Name! Lutherans believe that Jesus Christ is present in the Sacrament so that we receive His true body and blood along with the bread and wine (Mark 14:22, 24; 1 Corinthians 10:16). We further believe that in this Sacrament, we receive the forgiveness of sins (Matthew 26:28) and strength to live an improved Christian life (Galatians 2:20). A worthy communicant is one who is truly repentant of his/her sins and who resolves to amend his/her life (1 Corinthians 11:28). Furthermore, this Sacrament is not only a communion with Christ (Matthew 18:20; 1 Corinthians 10:16), but also with one another (1 Corinthians 10:17; Acts 2:42). Those desiring to commune with us for the first time should talk with the pastor BEFORE the service begins.

This is a chance to invite a friend so they can see what our church has to offer in bringing Christ to our communities. There will be a social hour after the worship service with doughnuts and coffee cakes and drinks.

The church picnic will be held on Sunday, August 17th, at the church and hall. It will be a potluck. The worship service will begin at 10 AM in the church and there will not be adult Bible Class or Sunday School. The meal will be in the fellowship hall with games for adults and children indoors and outdoors depending on the weather.

Operation Christmas Child! We will be packing shoe boxes for Operation Christmas Child in November for children in poor countries across the world. Since school supplies are on sale NOW, this would be a good time to purchase the items needed. We need 8 glue sticks, 7 pencil sharpeners, 24 boxes of crayons, 58 pencils, 24 bars of soap, 23 boxes of markers (10-12 packs), 17 boxes of colored pencils, 14 wash cloths, 17 nail clippers, and 23 individual packages of Kleenex. We usually pack 12 boxes for boys and 12 boxes for girls. If you prefer to give a cash donation, we would be glad to buy items that are needed. There will be a collection box on the last pew by the balcony stairs. Two Thrivent Action Team cards will be used to buy larger items and to pay the \$10 postage fee (maybe more) for each box.
